Board Match Program

for Individuals

At the Center, we believe strong nonprofits make stronger communities.

The Center for Nonprofit Advancement has created a **Board Match** Program to facilitate relationship building between interested individuals and organizations that are in need of new perspectives on their Board of Directors.

Step One:

Complete and submit the attached application form. This form asks questions pertaining to your background and interests.

Step Two:

All applications are reviewed by a panel of experts to make the best quality matches between the individuals and the nonprofit organizations. If any additional information is needed, follow up questions may occur at this stage.

Step Three:

Approved individual applicants will receive a minimum of three vetted nonprofit organizations that fit the needs submitted. Individuals are then responsible for independent research in order to rank these three organizations in order of preference.

Step Four:

The Center will facilitate an introduction between the organization and the individual, and recommend next steps.

Required

All applicants are required to attend the Center's **Board Basics A to Z** course. Offered multiple times a year, this one-day training provides a fundamental baseline for anyone hoping to serve on a nonprofit board. The course can be attended anytime during the application/review process, but must be completed prior to placement on a board.

No timeline or match is guaranteed in this process. Formal board placement will be the responsibility of the two parties. The Center will check in quarterly during year one.
